

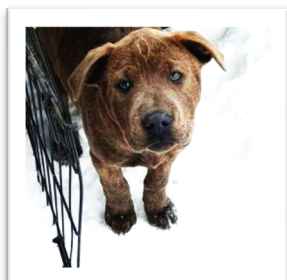
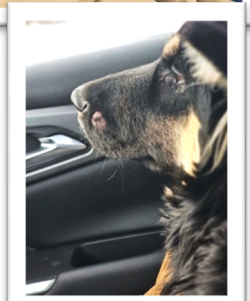
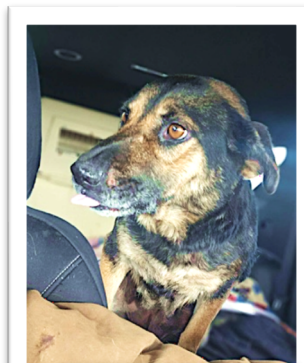
AFTER THE HOLIDAYS - THE QUIET MONTH THAT ISN'T

From the outside, January looks like a slowdown. The decorations come down, routines return, and the world gets quieter. In rescue, it rarely does.

After the holidays, the calls keep coming—often with a different kind of urgency. Pets are surrendered when schedules change or homes feel too hectic. Families facing hardship run out of options. And for animals without safe shelter, winter doesn't just feel harsh—it can be deadly. Cold hides suffering in plain sight: behind outbuildings, under porches, down rural roads, in places most people don't look when the wind bites.

January is when rescue becomes less about big moments and more about endurance: supply runs, medical care, careful monitoring. It's volunteers driving in brutal conditions because an animal can't wait for better weather. It's the quiet wins that keep us going—an animal finally eating, finally sleeping, finally relaxing enough to exhale. This month, that reality has a face.

We recently took in a new dog who was surrendered by her owner. She had been kept outside. Somewhere along the way, she gave birth—apparently without anyone realizing it—and none of her puppies survived. As if that loss wasn't enough, she was allowed to roam, and was hit by a car.



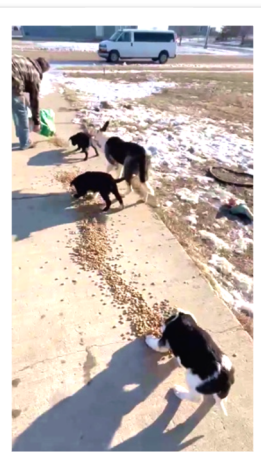
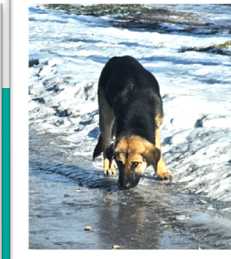
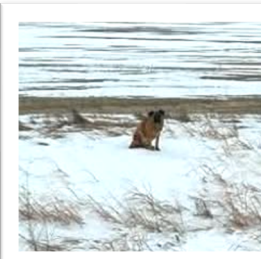
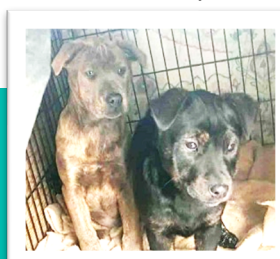
Our volunteers picked her up and brought her to safety. Now she's warm, fed, and finally getting the care she should have had all along. Right now, we're focused on what she needs most: comfort, healing, and time—the kind of time that lets a dog stop bracing for the next hard thing.

And she wasn't the only one. That same weekend, our team picked up several more dogs—each with their own story and needs. While their stories may be different, they all share one truth: **they have a chance now.** A chance to rest. A chance to heal. A chance to learn what safe feels like. A chance at a family.

Those chances depend on one thing we never have enough of: **open foster homes.** Fostering is what turns a rescue "yes" from a hope into an actual plan. It gives us the ability to say, *"Bring them—we have somewhere for them to go."* It creates breathing room and saves lives—especially in winter, when time matters and shelter is survival.

If you've been wondering how to help—this is it. **More fosters mean more lives saved.** It's that simple, and that powerful.

Because of our fosters and volunteers, these dogs aren't alone anymore. And with a few more helping hands and open homes, the next weekend like this can end with even more "picked up," "safe," and "on the way home."

FOSTERING: THE HELP THAT SAVES LIVES

People often tell us, "I wish I could do more." If you've ever felt that way, we want you to know something simple and true:

Fostering is one of the most powerful ways to help.

A foster home is more than a place to stay. It's a soft landing. It's a quiet room after a loud, scary world. It's a warm bed, a full bowl, and a chance to finally take a breath. For many dogs (and cats), it's the first time they've ever experienced safety—real safety—in a way their nervous system can believe.

And here's the part we don't say often enough: fostering changes the foster, too.

You get to witness the moments that make rescue worth it—first tail wags, first toys, first deep sleep, the day a shy dog chooses to lean into you. You see confidence return. You watch personalities bloom. You become part of a story that ends in a family, not a cold night.

Worried you don't have everything you need? We've got you. Our rescue provides what your foster needs—from **food, bedding, and toys to all vetting and medical care.** We'll also support you every step of the way, with guidance, check-ins, and a team that truly has your back.

And fostering doesn't have to mean a long commitment. Along with regular fosters, we urgently need **short-term fosters**—people who can step in for a **weekend, a few days, or a week** when our foster families need to travel for work, take a vacation, or handle life stuff. That temporary care is a *godsend*. It keeps animals stable, safe, and comfortable—and it keeps rescue moving.

And yes—fair warning—fostering is a little addictive. Once you see that first deep sleep or tail wag, it's hard not to want to help again. But the gift goes deeper than that: there is something profound about knowing you didn't just help—you **literally saved a life**. That kind of purpose stays with you. It's a gift you give...and a gift you get back.=

If you've been waiting for a sign that you're needed, this is it. You don't have to do it perfectly. You just have to do it with care.
